If you would like to record your own thoughts and messages, in memory of Her Majesty, a Book of Condolences is provided for our whole Community at St. Paulinus Church, Llangors until Tuesday 20th September. On behalf of the Community, our Clerk will then send the book to the Private Secretary at Buckingham Palace with a covering letter.

The Bell at Llangasty Church will toll one bell for each year of the Queen’s life on Day+1 at noon. The flag at St. Paulinus Church will be flown at half-mast until the day after the State Funeral.

If it is your wish to lay flowers, they may be laid in St. Paulinus Churchyard, Llangors – on the grass to the left of the footpath, on the approach to the Church door. Flowers should be unwrapped and not left in cellophane. On the day after the State Funeral our Community Clerk will move the flowers.

It may be your choice to make a donation to a charity that was supported by H.M. Queen Elizabeth instead of laying flowers. Buckingham Palace may issue a statement regarding donations in due course.

Plans are being made for a service to be held at St. Paulinus Church, Llangors, for all our community area possibly on the eve of the State Funeral. Further details will be published in due course.

The bi monthly meeting of the Community Council planned for 13/9/22 has been postponed until 20/9/22.
