What does the Community Council do?

Your Community Council is the part of local government that understands local needs, delivers some local services and works with other organisations such as the National Park Authority and Powys County Council to ensure that local interests are not overlooked.

In this role the Council represents local area interests in diverse ways such as responding to planning consultations, supporting other community groups and managing local facilities including public seating, the bus shelters, the Glebe Playing Field in Llanfihangel Talyllyn and St Paulinus Churchyard in Llangors.

The Councillors

Community Councillors are local residents who bring their various skills, experience and ideas to the role, along with their commitment to their communities, and collectively create local government that reflects the broad range of skills, experience and ideas living in those communities.

Llangors Community Council comprises councillors from Llangors, Llanfihangel Talyllyn, and Pennorth, and meets on the second Tuesday of every month at 7pm. Meetings are held between the community halls in Llangors, Llanfihangel and Llangasty.
